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Lower School Results 2017

Junior Department Key Stage 2

At the end of Year 6, the majority of our pupils reached levels of attainment beyond what would be expected for their age group.

English

The Mean Standardised Age Score for our Year 6 pupils was 113.2 versus a national average of 100.0 in English, 29% of our pupils achieved a "very high" score of over 126 versus 4% nationally.

Maths

The Mean Standardised Age Score for our Year 6 pupils was 112.1 versus a national average of 100.0 in Maths, 19% of our pupils achieved a "very high" score of over 126 versus 4% nationally.

11+ Success

We are proud to report that eight of our pupils were offered places at local grammar schools in 2017.

Preparatory Department Key Stage 1

At the end of Year 2, our teachers assess the children on their attainment in English and Maths. The results demonstrate the difference that a CHS education can make.

English

The Mean Standardised Age Score for our Year 2 pupils was 112.7 versus a national average of 100.0 in English, 20% of our pupils achieved a "very high" score of over 126 versus 4% nationally.

Maths

The Mean Standardised Age Score for our Year 2 pupils was 112.2 versus a national average of 100.0 in Maths, 15% of our pupils achieved a "very high" score of over 126 versus 4% nationally.

Reception

By the end of Reception year, the benefits of a Colchester High School education are clear, as you can see in the levels of attainment reached by our children in relation to literacy and numeracy, and the three prime areas of learning: communication and language; physical development; and social and emotional development.

Percentage of pupils making a "good level of development"

94% of our boys and girls achieve a 'good level of development'. The national average was 69.3% in 2016.

A "good level of development" relates to achieving at least the expected level within the three primary areas of learning and the early learning goals within literacy and numeracy. The levels shown are teacher assessed levels of pupil attainment.

Hertfordshire Reading Test

100% of pupils achieved a reading age of over 1 year above their chronological reading age with 70% achieving over 1 and a half years above. 5 children achieved a reading age 2 years above with the highest score being 4 years above their chronological age.
