

Termly Committee Meeting: Spring Term 2018 Minutes Date of Meeting: February 1st Venue: CHS Refectory at 8.40am

1. Apologies for Absence - Murdo

2. Resignation of Trustee - Murdo

Formal notification of the resignation of Jo Bradley. Noted and thanked.

3. Highlights from Autumn Term - Murdo

The CHSA raised over £2500 (after expenses) by running a Lower School Disco, the Christmas Fayre, the Christmas Cards and the Christmas Gift Stall. During this period we also have spent money on capital expenses which reduced the profit this year but will last for several years, such as Christmas Decorations, Christmas Trees, Popcorn machine. We also have stock remaining for the Christmas Gift Stall and Santa presents.

Our promise was also to make communication of the CHSA easier, to share updates, events and share the children's joy from the funded activities. Our new CHSA Facebook page went live which has 107 members to date and is helping to spread the word. We also have WhatsApp groups for the CHSA Committee and one for the Chair and Vice Chairs, and we wanted to share that over 6000 WhatsApp messages have been shared in these forums- so it shows just how much work and support there is within these groups!

2 of the Vice Chairs, and Helen also met with the Senior School Council to talk through their interest and found they are keen on bake sales, Break the Rules Day, and Film Nights.

4. Financial Overview – Helen Clarke

Helen provided an overview of expenses and outstanding funding requests with current funds around **£9,000 available**.

5. Communications Strategy – Caroline

We talked about how we can get more people to join the CHSA Facebook site and join the Committee, so that we have a better spread across the whole school.

Suggestions included printing a summary of the bids/events and putting it in book bags, giving out leaflets at Parents Evenings, especially at the Senior School as often they don't



attend the school, sending out termly updates on Firefly and trying to get a year group rep from each year to be a conduit to all parents. Suggestion to also use the News Team in the school.

Action – Murdo and team review if/how we could share about CHSA at the events where parents attend

Action - Murdo and team to write termly update on Firefly

Action- Murdo and team to use the Easter Egg Hunt for the Lower School, as a way to publicise the CHSA Facebook site

Action- Murdo and team to put a note out to CHSA Committee and the Facebook to encourage Year Group reps to come forward

Action- Helen to clarify more about the News Team and how they could support.

It is also recognised that not every parent can join CHSA Termly Meetings, or activity support, however we would like to enable people to provide their views on Bids prior to all meetings.

Action – Murdo and team will work out how to put voting option on the CHSA Facebook to encourage people to vote offline.

It is also noted that the CHSA Chair and Vice Chair will review and approve bids, on an adhoc basis, where a bid has come in mid-term and cannot wait until the next termly meeting.

Action- Murdo and team will review with Helen whether we can ask for bids 1 week before so they can be sent out to the Committee and CHSA Facebook for offline bidding. We will also look at if/how we communicate reviewing bids outside of the termly meetings. We will also write a Terms of Reference for they types of bids we accept to help provide guidance to those put bids in, and for consistency of approvals.

6. Funding Requests

Approved Bids = £2,872

- Year 11 Prom Request £887. Some Year 11 pupils and Miss Banks presented their case for extras to make the Prom more personal and memorable. Year 11 will also raise £ themselves. We reviewed if we bought the Letter Lights for longer term use however they are expensive and storage is an issue. £887 Approved
- After School Club toys Request £315 for play equipment. Noted that they have not previously asked for money as they get parent donations, however many toys are



'tired' and they have limited outdoor toys. Request from CHSA to ask parents for new donations. **£200 - Approved**

- **Gardening Club** Request £269.95. Joanna Riddell presented and shared how the school has an allotment and are looking for funding for a shed to store equipment. The school pays the rent. We recommend we fund £300 so it is the best shed that is sturdy and the best value. **£300 Approved**
- Year 6 Yearbooks £525 requested. Last year this was not funded however upon review the Committee are keen to fund this, similar to the Year 11 leavers donation. This is for 40 books. Clarity required on exact budget as quote was from last year. £525 approved.
- After School Production Club for Lion King (Year 3-6) requested £550. This is requested after the cost has been paid and assumption is that they will fund this via ticket sales if they do not get the CHSA funding. The funds would be used for license, scrips, drums etc. Upon review it was agreed that the CHSA would fund bids which provide long term future use or skills. We will ask the bidders to review what can be used long term so we can review the funding. Murdo and team will rereview once this is understood. CHSA are happy to also run the Popcorn stall and drinks and profit return to the project. £550 rejected but request revised bid
- First Aid course for Nursery to Y6 requested £800. Request from Mrs Brammall to provide all with First Aid skills. This was reviewed in October and agreed by Murdo and the Vice Chairs. £960 approved.
