



### **YEAR 7 CUFFLEY TRIP**

Our EYFS children enjoyed their first forest school experience this week. Mr Rayner, our Forest School leader and Head of Outdoor Learning and Global Enrichment, took the children to Hilly Fields and showed them the wonder of the great outdoors. The children learnt the names of different plants and the ones to avoid with thorns and brambles. Several eager eyed children spotted the squirrels getting ready for Autumn.

Forest School has a positive impact on all children in terms of developing social skills and relationships and increasing confidence. By fostering a love of the outside and caring for the environment children become thoughtful, motivated learners, inquisitive about the world around them. Their mental health, language, communication and physical skills all benefit from the great outdoors - whatever the weather!

**William** - Last week, we went to Cuffley to get to know the Year 7s better. It was incredible, we made fires, built shelters and traps, we even did an activity where the plane crashed and we had to help the people get out who got injured. It was really fun. Some days we got to make our own food as well. We made dinner and breakfast and the food was delectable. I just managed to survive the last day and was so happy to go home.

**Joseph** - When we woke up, we always had a great activity waiting for us. I really liked the walk in the dark, because of all the noises of different animals late at night. The skills that I learnt were so cool like lighting a fire with a magnifying glass or saving someone from a plane crash.

I really enjoyed one activity called night stalking. Night Stalking was where all of Year 7 went for a walk in the night. Cuffley taught me many skills like starting a fire, knowing how to save a life and build a den.
