



WINTER UNIFORM REMINDER

As Winter has now well and truly arrived we would like to remind all parents about the following uniform rules.

Nursery and Prep School - Only the blue regulation navy waterproof fleece-lined coat, regulation blue hat and/or regulation scarf should be worn.

Senior School

- Coats, hats and scarfs should be plain or navy. No fashionable designs. No sewn-on badges or hoodie type coats.
- Regulation school knee-length grey skirt for Years 7 to 9 should be worn with grey/black tights (winter) or grey/black ankle length socks.
- Regulation school knee-length black suit skirt to be worn with black tights (winter) or black ankle socks
- All pupils should wear black leather school shoes. Trainers are NOT to be worn to school.
- All children should bring a coat to school each day.
