The key fact is that all of the most used AI sites have an age restriction of 13 with parental permission required for anyone using AI under the age of 18. At CPHS we take the digital safety of our pupils very seriously and are working hard to ensure that all staff understand the potential pitfalls and peaks of the use of AI in the classroom.
