Caring for the environment is a top priority at CPHS. Following our school's endeavours to 'Lead on Net Zero', our school sustainability strategy has meant that this year we are focusing on reducing waste, improving recycling, and saving electricity. Our Eco-Club, who meet on a Wednesday afternoon are instrumental to this and have created an anti-waste campaign with the slogan, "Waste is Foe, Let's Make it Go!" The ultimate aim is reduce our total waste collected by the school by 10% and increase the total amount recycled by the school to be increased by 10% by July 2024.

At CPHS we understand that it is the small, everyday actions which are having a direct impact on the future we want for ourselves and our communities – we are the change! Reducing our waste is a big task, however, in the words of Sir David Attenborough, "If working apart, we are a force powerful enough to destabilise our planet, surely working together, we are powerful enough to save it."

Waste statistics

- 12 million tonnes of plastic go into the ocean every year
- Globally, 1 million plastic water bottles are used every minute, and it takes 400 years for each one to break down.

To help achieve our goal of reducing waste by 10% at CPHS this year, after half term we are implementing Tupperware Tuesdays.

Please help your children to make a positive impact and receive House points by packing waste-free snacks and lunches on these days. Look out too, for our Sustainable Fashion event on Friday 5 July.

It has also been a fantastic opportunity this week to meet with so many of our Year 10 pupils during their interviews to become a school prefect. Listening to their pride and passion for our school and their many contributions to clubs, activities and pupil voice groups has been awe inspiring and a real privilege. 










Tupperware Tuesdays

Here are a few tips and tricks to get you started!

- Only send reusable water bottles to school. Please don't send any single use plastic bottles or juice boxes.
- Try to give your child fruit or vegetables in their lunches and snacks – this is the healthiest option to keep them focussed and is the best for the planet.
- Send snacks and lunches in reusable containers (e.g. Tupperware or waxed cloth bags/wraps) rather than cling film, aluminium foil, or plastic bags.
- Buy snacks in bulk and portion out into reusable containers instead of buying things that are individually wrapped.
 Why just go waste-free on Tuesdays? We encourage you to reduce lunch and snack-time waste every day of the week!



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Our Eco-club have been spending time weeding in the bedded areas ready to start creating 'pollinator friendly' gardens in school. This ties in nicely for World Bee day which was Monday 20 May. It is important to protect and preserve our bees as numbers are decreasing. 




UKMT challenge

Musical Tour



Congratulations




